Filipino Community Checklist

A practical starting point from the Filipino Town Las Vegas Business Directory

Before you commit

- ☐ Compare neighborhoods, commute routes, household needs, school preferences, and your budget before choosing a home.
- ☐ Visit an area at different times of day when possible; traffic, noise, and access can change throughout the week.
- ☐ Confirm lease terms, deposits, utility responsibilities, and any neighborhood rules directly with the property owner or manager.
- ☐ Keep copies of your housing, employment, medical, and identification documents in a secure place.

Your first week

- ☐ Set up the services your household needs, such as electricity, water, internet, health care, school enrollment, and transportation.
- ☐ Save the addresses and phone numbers for essential services, your workplace or school, and trusted contacts.
- ☐ Learn the routes between your home, work or school, grocery options, and health-care providers.
- ☐ Use official government, school, transit, and health-care websites to confirm current programs, hours, and eligibility.

Find your Filipino community

- ☐ Browse local Filipino and Pinoy Facebook Groups for neighborhood conversations, cultural events, and moving tips. Review each group's rules before participating.
- ☐ Explore Filipino grocery stores, restaurants, and everyday services through the Filipino Town Las Vegas Business Directory.
- ☐ Connect with Filipino American organizations that match your professional, cultural, provincial, or volunteer interests.
- ☐ Contact churches or faith communities directly to confirm current service times and programs.
- ☐ Visit the Filipino Town Cultural District along South Maryland Parkway to explore cultural anchors and directory destinations.
